



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q. What is Act2Impact Model United Nations (AIM)?

A. AIM - the Act2Impact Model United Nations, an initiative of Worldview, is a simulation of the United Nations where students will engage finding sustainable and innovative solutions to some of the world's most pressing issues while emulating global leaders.

At AIM, the committees will be hosted by representatives of the International Relations Associations of various prestigious universities and will engage students from these Universities to form its staff pool who have decades of cumulative experience . In addition to the Model UN Conference, participants will be engaged using powerful learning tools like Interactive Webinars and Project Management workshops to transform their constructive dialogue in committees into real and decisive action in the society.

Q. What is the Backpack by Worldview?

A. Backpack by Worldview is a digital learning platform where students can access resources that will cover a range of topics to provide students with the required support to prepare for the entire program, that is the Model UN and beyond. This platform will consist various learning elements such as webinars, bite-sized modules and reading material and will be provided to the students once they sign up for the conference.

Q. What is a Model United Nations Conference?

A. A Model United Nations Conference (MUN) is an academic simulation of the United Nations where students will take on the role of diplomats representing various countries and discuss global issues at a policymaking level with the objective of finding mutually acceptable solutions. At AIM, the Model UN will be held in an expo format where multiple committees will run by representatives of the International Relations Associations of various prestigious universities.

Q. What is the Impact Initiative?

A. The Impact Initiative is an initiative of Worldview where students will get an opportunity to take their learnings from MUN beyond committees into positive action by building their own Impact Projects and showcase their ideas at a global platform.

At AIM, we are committed to providing a platform to students to translate the discussions that take place in their committees into positive action in the society. We believe every young mind of today carries ideas to create a positive impact in this context we aim to deliver a learning experience within and beyond committees to nurture the problem solvers within Gen-Z Students and enable to become Gen-S or a Generation of Solvers!

Q. Is it mandatory for me to participate in the Impact Initiative?

A. No, it is not mandatory for you to participate in the Impact Initiative! However, we believe that the Model UN community understands the complex global challenges that the world faces tomorrow and can use their learnings from a Model UN to take action and create an impact in the community, thereby becoming the change-makers of tomorrow. In line this vision, we would encourage you to participate in the Impact Initiative as well and we are sure this will be a meaningful learning experience for you.

Q. Can I register as an Individual?

A. Yes, you can refer as an individual. Please do refer to our terms and conditions on the website before registering. However, we would recommend you register as a group since we believe there are several advantages of registering as a delegation instead of individuals. Students who register as a delegation are generally allocated the same country and can prepare for the Model UN conference together and work around their projects for the Impact Initiative.

Q. Can I participate as a private delegation?

A. Yes, you can form a private delegation with a group of friends even if you are not from the same school. Please do refer to our terms and conditions on the website before registering.

Q. How many students can register together as a delegation?

A. There is no minimum or maximum number of students in a Delegation.

Q. Do I have to attend this conference with a Faculty Advisor?

A. It is not mandatory to have a Faculty Advisor to participate in the conference however you will be required to submit a consent letter signed by your parent or legal guardian at the time of confirmation.

Q. Can faculty advisors attend the sessions?

A. Although faculty advisors cannot participate during any of the sessions, faculty advisors are allowed, and encouraged, to be present as silent observers during the sessions.

Q. When does the conference start and end?

A. The MUN conference will take place from the 26th to 28th March, followed by the Impact Initiative.

Q. What is the registration process?

A. The faculty advisor or the Head Delegate can register on behalf of all the students on our website. They can visit this website here : <https://www.worldview.global/aim-mena>. Please note that in case students are coming from the same school or group, they do not have to register individually and the Faculty Advisor or Head Delegate can submit the application on their behalf.

Q. What is the payment process?

A. Once you register for the conference, our team will get in touch with you for the payment process. You will be required to share some details for us to generate an invoice for you after which we will share a payment link for you to make the payment!

Q. What is judging criteria for the Impact Initiative?

A. The judging criteria for the Impact Initiative will shortly be announced. Please contact our team at aim@worldview.global for more information.

Q. How should I start my preparations for the program?

A. Once a student confirms their participation, they will get access to Backpack by Worldview that is designed to deliver an engaging, accessible and interactive learning experience and will cover a range of topics to provide students with the required support to prepare for the Model United Nations and build their impact project!

The AIM team will provide you access to background guides and webinars. Background guides help you understand your topic better and help with your preparation and the Secretariat prepares for a background guide for each committee being simulated. Additionally, a live webinar will be conducted closer to the conference, where you will be briefed about the Rules of Procedure and you can interact with your Chairs and Directors.

Q. I did not get the country or committee of my choice. Can I change my allocation?

A. While we try our best to allocate according to your stated country & committee preferences, allocations are ultimately at the discretion of the Secretariat and all allocations are final. Please know that the Secretariat has taken into account the committees and countries that you'll be able to perform and grow in, to further your MUN experience and allocated accordingly. We firmly believe that AIM should be a place for delegates to learn about new ideas and engage in new experiences. All of the directors on our team are highly skilled and dedicated to fashioning an amazing educational experience for all delegates and we urge you to take advantage of this when you attend the conference this November.

Q. I am passionate about a specific committee and I have not gotten allocated to this committee, however I want to build my project around this committee?

The projects that you choose to work on, do not necessarily have to be related to the Model UN committee allocated to you. The project topic could be related to or at the intersection of any of the committees or Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). We would encourage you to look at your experience in committees as a tool to further understand global challenges and unlock the skills you require to become the change-makers of tomorrow!

Q. What is the refund and cancellation policy?

A. We do not have a refund or cancellation policy. The delegate fees are non-refundable, non-exchangeable, and non-reversible in any circumstances. Please ensure you read our Terms and Condition Document carefully before registering for the conference.

Q. Is there any financial aid available to participate in the conference?
